



This Russian icon was created by Ivan Lvovich, a Russian iconographer, and Fr. Aleksandr Burgos, a Byzantine Catholic priest based in St. Petersburg, which was started by the two men in 2002 and completed in 2005.

The circle where Mary's heart is holds the Russian word sertse, meaning "heart," written in gold and surrounded by thorns. The Fatima icon also bears two unique Russian inscriptions: One is its title: "Image of the Holiest Virgin of Fatima." The second – "Toboyu Yedinstvo" – roughly translates to mean "In you is Unity."
